

10 MILE CONCRETE REPAIR WORK TO START JULY 8 IN SOUTHFIELD

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC), in partnership with the City of Southfield, will begin the 10 Mile Road concrete-replacement project between Evergreen Road and Greenfield Road on July 8. The work will be completed in the fall.

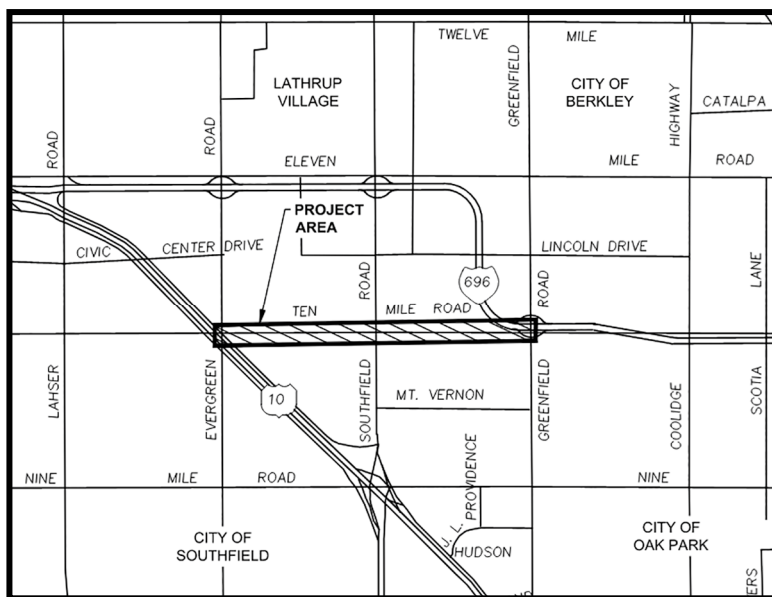
PROJECT DETAILS

The project will include replacing concrete roadway and curbs/gutters in the westbound and center left-turn lanes of 10 Mile between Evergreen Road and Southfield Road, and the eastbound lanes between Southfield Road and Greenfield Road. The project also includes upgrades to pedestrian crosswalks to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and traffic signal upgrades at the Santa Barbara and Pierce intersections. Work completed as part of this project will complement work completed in the 2019 project in this section of 10 Mile Road.

IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

Traffic will be maintained throughout the project, with one lane open in each direction. Lanes will be shifted during the project to accommodate construction.

Access to properties along 10 Mile Road will be maintained at all times during the



project, though there will be temporary side-street and driveway closures to facilitate pavement placement.

FUNDING AND CONTRACTOR

This project is expected to cost approximately \$5.2 million. Eighty percent of the cost will be covered with federal road funds. The remainder will be covered by RCOC. The work will be done by DiLisio Contracting Inc. of Clinton Twp.
