# CITY OF SOUTHFIELD ELECTED OFFICIALS

Southfield's residents are represented by their elected municipal officials, who are responsible for setting City government policy and serve as the direct citizen link to City Hall.

**The Mayor** serves a four-year term and is responsible for reviewing the annual budget prepared by the City Administrator and presents it, with his recommendations, to City Council for their approval. Mayoral duties also include representing the City at official functions; appointing the City Planner, City Assessor and City Attorney as well as members to several citizen boards and commissions; and validating all bonds, notes, contracts and Council-authorized items. The Mayor also has veto power over Council actions, with at least five affirmative votes by Council required to override a Mayoral veto.

The seven-member **Southfield City Council** is the City's legislative and policy-making body. Council is responsible for adopting the annual City budget, contracts, laws, ordinances and resolutions; approving purchases, zoning and planning requests; and granting permit and license fees. Council members are elected at large to four-year terms, with the low vote-getter in each election receiving a two-year term. Elections are held biennially in odd-numbered years.

**The City Clerk** is the official records-keeper for the City of Southfield whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to City Council proceedings, actions, agenda items, ordinances, resolutions, licenses, birth and death records, files on easements, payback agreements and rights-of way, as well as special assessment and zoning notices. The City Clerk is the director of elections and is responsible for voter registration. The City Clerk examines and audits all accounts and claims against the City and classifies, approves, signs, and records all vouchers for payment from budget accounts. The Clerk is elected to a four-year term.

**The City Treasurer** is accountable for all City monies, including taxes, assessments, license fees, and water bill payments. The Treasurer helps generate additional income through the investment of municipal funds with the assistance of an investment counselor. The Treasurer also administers the Police and Fire Retirement Fund and serves as ex-officio member of several City boards and commissions. The Treasurer is elected to a four-year term.

City Council study and regular meetings are generally held at 6 p.m. in the Council Study and Council Chambers respectively. All regular meetings are cablecast live on City Cable 15 and can also be streamed live at [www.cityofsouthfield.com](http://www.cityofsouthfield.com).

The Court includes five divisions: Court Administration; Civil Infractions and Parking; Misdemeanor and Felony; Civil and Probation. All traffic and parking violations; criminal misdemeanors and felony preliminary examinations; small claims disputes up to \$3,000; landlord/tenant and land contract forfeiture disputes; and civil lawsuits up to \$25,000 are processed by the Court.

The Oakland Mediation Center, a private, nonprofit organization providing community dispute resolution services as an alternative to traditional court proceedings, is available on site. The Center receives referrals from the Court, Legal and other City departments. It relieves Court caseloads and instructs citizens in valuable conflict resolution skills, providing an excellent community resource.



**Frederick E. Zorn** was appointed as the Southfield City Administrator in 2014. Appointed by and reporting directly to City Council, he is responsible for the City's daily operations, preparing the annual municipal budget, conducting studies and making recommendations on City operations to City Council. The City Administrator also directs the administrative staff, appoints most management employees with City Council's confirmation, and ensures enforcement of all City laws and ordinances.

# SOUTHFIELD PHOTO PRIZE

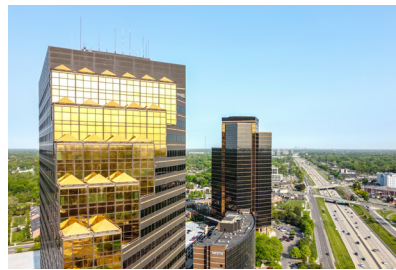
Photo Competition & Public Art Exhibition

## 2025 PHOTO PRIZE CRITERIA FOR SUBMISSIONS:

- Contestant must live, work, worship or attend school in Southfield;
- Original digital color photograph of Southfield landmark or other subject matter shot within the City of Southfield borders taken in any season or format (color or b&w).
- Photographs may be edited with dodging, burning, cropping and color corrections. No other obvious photo editing is permitted.
- If cropping, please utilize a ratio of 4x3 or 3x4 for contest prints and calendar. City staff reserve the right to re-crop photos based on needs.
- Photograph must be high resolution: at least 300 DPI (Dots Per Inch) and 2000 pixels submitted in JPEG, TIFF or PDF file format (which can be achieved with most cameras and phones);
- The City of Southfield reserves the right to use all entries in marketing and other materials – expressly the City’s 2026 calendar;
- May submit up to three (3) total shots for consideration per person; and
- Submissions must be e-mailed as an attachment to [PHOTOCONTEST@CITYOFSOUTHFIELD.COM](mailto:PHOTOCONTEST@CITYOFSOUTHFIELD.COM) by **May 30, 2025**.
- Submissions that do not meet above criteria will not be eligible for the competition.

# BUDGET FY2024-2025

The Mayor and City Council have produced a responsible plan in the 2024-25 budget based on careful examination of the community's service needs and the financial capacity to meet those needs. Planned revenues and expenditures for the 2024-25 fiscal year ending on June 30, 2025 are indicated on the graphs below.

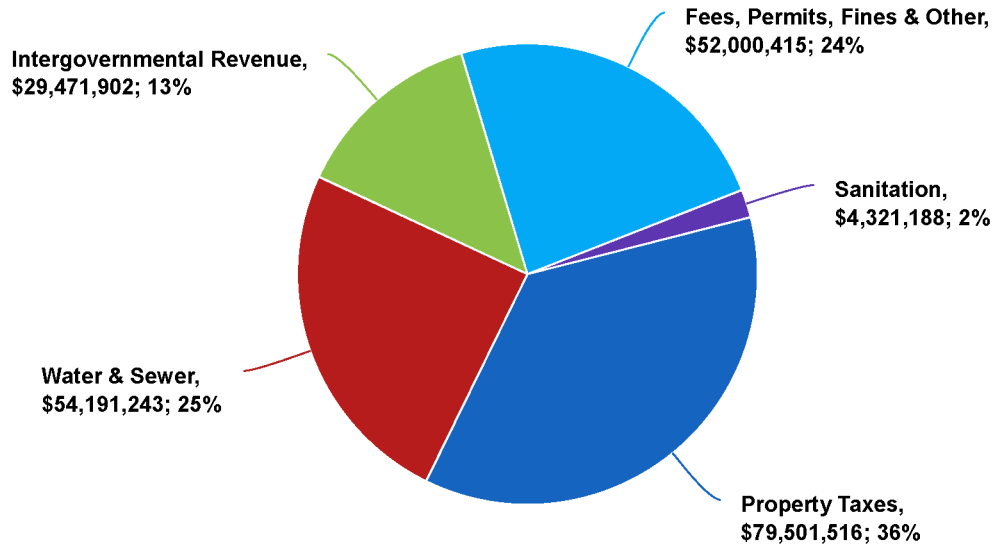
## Revenue Snapshot

- Property taxes represent 61% of General Fund revenues and 36% of all funds revenue. Projected taxable value is \$3,157,576,313 which represents an increase of approximately \$183 million or 6.2% over the 2023-24 projection.
- The millage rate decreased by 0.8405 mills comprised of 0.4269 decrease in the Police & Fire Pension rate, by a decrease of 0.0010 to the Public Act 59 rate, a decrease of 0.1826 for Drains at Large, and a 0.23 decrease in the TGO Road Bond rate. The resultant levy is 26.7174 mills.
- State shared revenues increased by approximately 2% compared to the prior budget year. Constitutional and statutory revenue payments from the State of Michigan are projected at \$8,433,612 and \$1,276,760, respectively and represent 11% of the General Fund revenues.
- Combined General fund revenues are proposed at approximately \$100.6 million, a 3.4% increase over 2023-24.
- Total revenues of all funds are proposed at approximately \$219.5 million, a 2.5% increase from 2023-2024.

## Expenditure Snapshot

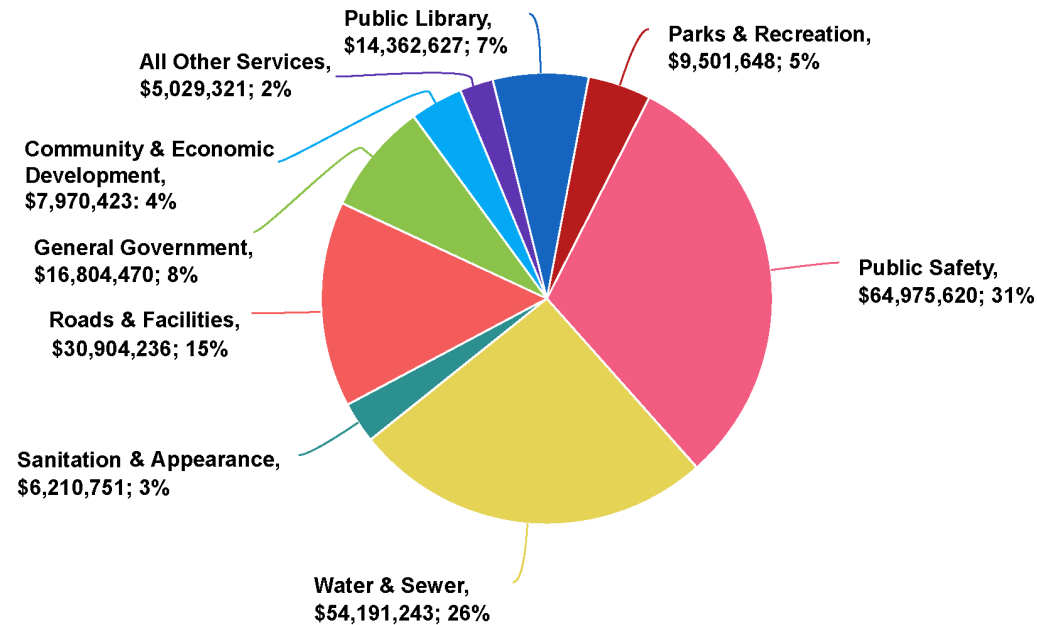
- At \$60.4 million, Police and Fire services continue to be the largest General Fund expenditure, making up approximately 60% of all General Fund expenditures, an increase of \$4.0 million over the prior year.
- The proposed budget includes approximately \$17 million for general government expenditures. These costs comprise approximately 17% of the General Fund expenditures and include Administration, elected officials, City Clerk, City Attorney, City Treasurer, Assessing, Fiscal Services, Technology Services, Human Resources, and Community Relations.
- Combined General Fund expenditures are proposed at approximately \$100.6 million, a 3.4% increase from 2023-24.
- Total expenditures of all funds are proposed at approximately \$219.5 million, a 2.5% increase from 2023-24.

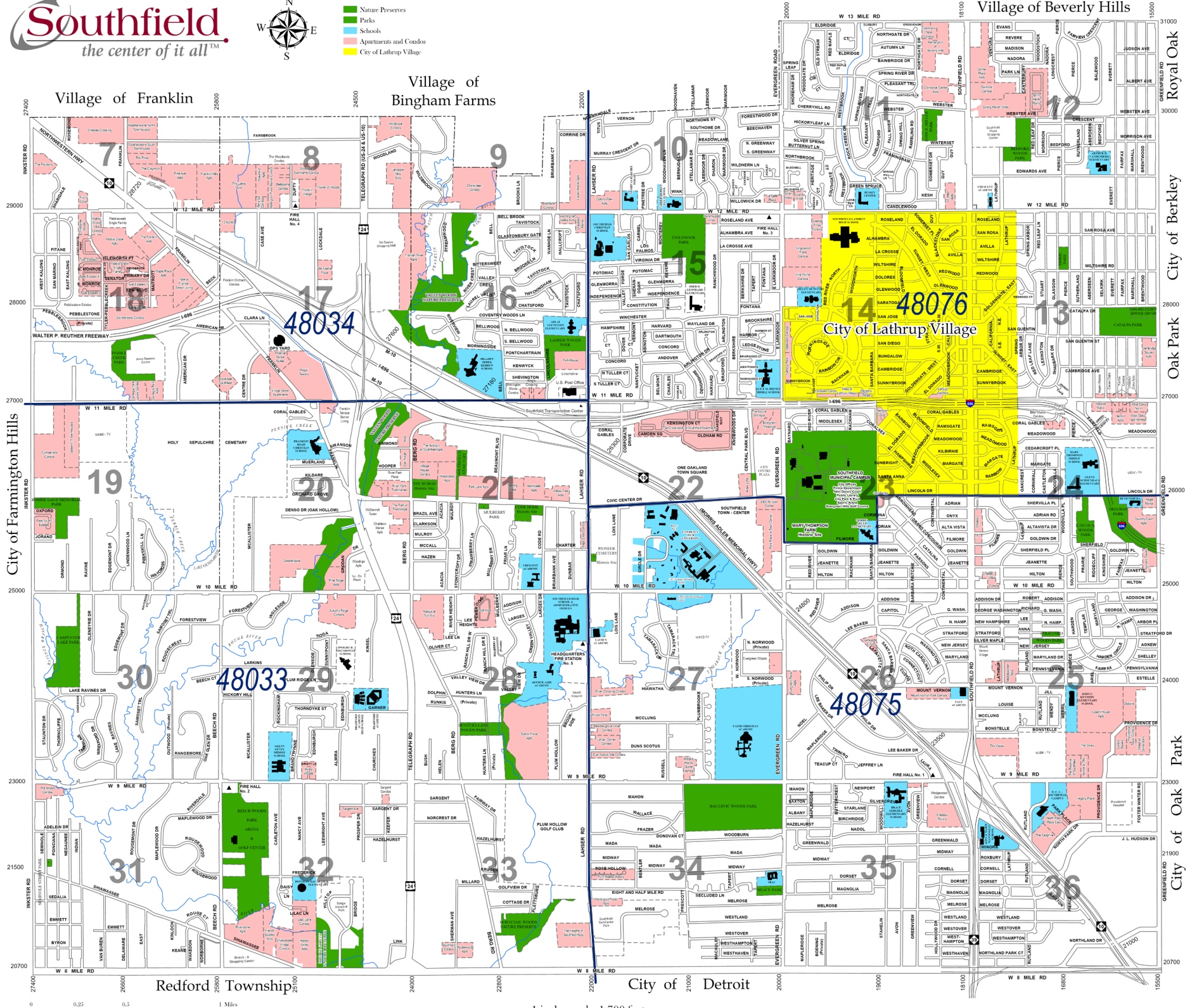
